

The **Take it to the Box** program promotes the safe disposal of unneeded and/or expired prescription and over the counter medications. This includes both **human** and **animal** medications along with **illegal drugs**.

## Preventing Medication Misuse and Abuse

A growing concern in our community is the abuse, by youth and others, of medications not prescribed to them. Safe disposal makes medications less available.

## Take unneeded prescriptions and over-the-counter medication to:

**Keep the medication in its original container.**

**Leave the name of the drug and other content information clearly visible. Remove the name and other identifying information by scratching the person's name out, covering with a permanent marker, or by cutting that part of the label off.**

**Drop medication into the disposal box opening.**
