## **ORDINANCE NO. 2016-3**

## AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO WINTER PARKING IN THE CITY OF COTTONWOOD

Section 1. <u>Definitions</u>. For the purpose of this Ordinance:

- A. "Street" means any street, avenue, alley, or other public road or way within the City of Cottonwood.
- B. "Vehicle" means every device in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a street or highway, and includes but is not limited to automobiles, vans, trucks, busses, motorcycles, bicycles, recreational vehicles, tractors, all-terrain vehicles, snowmobiles, and trailers.
- Section 2. Winter Parking. It shall be unlawful to park, or permit any vehicle to remain parked, on any street from November 15<sup>th</sup> to April 15<sup>th</sup> between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m., or until the streets are plowed from curb to curb, during or following any snow fall or significant ice accumulation.
- Section 3. Winter Parking in the Central Business District. No person shall stop, stand, or park any vehicle or permit it to stand on any street in any of the following places at any of the following times between November 15<sup>th</sup> and April 15<sup>th</sup> on Main Street between Barstad Road and West Second Street, and on West First Street between Barstad Road and Front Street between the hours of 2:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. on any day.
- Section 4. <u>Penalty</u>. Any vehicle found in violation of this ordinance is subject to a parking citation.
- Section 5. <u>Repeal</u>. Section 7.118 of the Cottonwood City Code of 1976, relating to winter parking, and all other ordinances, resolutions, and acts and proceedings of the City and of the Council which are inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance are hereby amended or repealed to the extent necessary to give full force and effect to this Ordinance.

Section 6. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance becomes effective from and after its passage and publication.
