

CAMDEN REGIONAL TRAIL

The Camden Regional Trail provides over 14 miles of off-road, paved, multi-use and multi-season use. The trail provides users with opportunities to experience a natural setting, where wildlife, historical sites, prairie landscapes, and winding rivers are part of the overall experience. This trail serves multiple communities in the heart of Southwest Minnesota.



The development, design, and construction of this trail are the result of a unique multi-jurisdictional collaboration by the City of Marshall, the City of Lynd, Lyon County, the Minnesota Department of Transportation, and the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. Sources of funding have included \$2,595,485 in State Legacy Funds as well as contributions from our local partners.

The trail boasts a variety of birding and wildlife interest for the trail users. The trail site, with its prairie land and grasses, is of interest to the avid bird watcher as its location is the eastern edge of the western bird population.

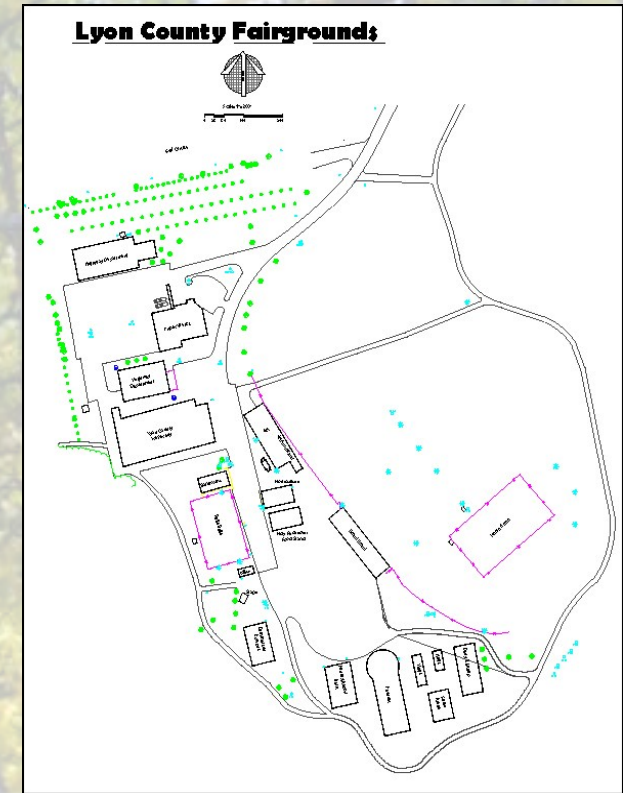
