- A. GBERBA Update Handout Update on the Area 5 MAWQCP
- B. MAWQCP 2022 Financial Assistance Grant –Handout up to \$5000 in cost-share for approved conservation projects through MAWQCP
- C. #03/22 BE Jacob Hoffmann -Alternative Intakes Cost Share Contract Approval Handout and Approval 12 open intakes to be removed and replaced with dense pattern tile. \$701.86 estimate to convert each intake was used for cost-share. Total= \$8,422.32. SWCD policy allows for 75% cost-share per intake, not to exceed \$500 per intake. \$6000 cost-share through SWCD. Motion by Deutz, second by Laleman. All in favor, motion carried.
- D. #15/22 Clark Family Farms, LLC Kelly Jones Grassed Waterway Cost Share Contract Approval Olson explained severe erosion near outlet portion of waterway exceeded 2' deep gully. existing waterway has exceeded its 10 year life span, was constructed in mid-1980's. Motion by Laleman, 2nd by Deutz to approve the Grassed Waterway Contract and Encumber funds in the amount of \$10,927.50, which is 75% of the total cost of \$14,570.00 with landowner amount of \$3,642.50. Encumbered amount of \$10,927.50 will be from FY 2021 Conservation Delivery. All in favor, motion carried.
- E. Lake Marshall Section 28 Dam Retention Repair Cost Share Funds Request Handout and Approval Lake Marshall, Section 28 has a dam that currently has a blown-out culvert. The dam elevation is 1190' at the top and the original design was for a 12'culvert. The new design would

raise the top of the dam about 2' in elevation. Giles asks SWCD board for 15% cost-share, landowner asked to contribute 10%, County Board approved 75% assistance through Buffer Enforcement funds on August 9th. 15% cost-share would be \$6,441.62. Total cost estimate: \$42,944.11. Giles does not yet have a contract for the Board to approve, will bring contract forward at Sept SWCD meeting. Motion by Prairie, second by Laleman to pursue contract. All in favor, motion carried.

- **F.** #16/22 Kurt Gillund Well Sealing Cost Share Contract -Approval Well Sealing Cost Share Contract for Kurt Gillund. Total amount of \$800.00. Motion by Laleman, 2nd by Deutz to approve \$400.00 which is 50% up to \$500.00 per Well Sealing Policy. \$400.00 will be taken out of FY 21 Local Water Management. All in favor, motion carried
- **G.** #17/22- Kurt Gillund Well Sealing Cost Share Contract Approval Well Sealing Cost Share Contract for Kurt Gillund. Total amount of \$675.00. Motion Deutz, 2nd by Laleman to approve \$337.50 which is 50% up to \$500.00 per Well Sealing Policy. \$337.50 will be taken out of FY 21 Local Water Management. All in favor, motion carried
- H. #18/22 City of Marshall, Well Sealing Cost Share Contract Approval Well Sealing Cost Share Contract for City of Marshall. Total amount of \$800.00. Motion Prairie, 2nd by Laleman to approve \$400.00 which is 50% up to \$500.00 per Well Sealing Policy. \$400.00 will be taken out of FY 21 Local Water Management. All in favor, motion carried
- I. #19/22- City of Marshall, Well Sealing Cost Share Contract Approval Well Sealing Cost Share Contract for City of Marshall. Total amount of \$995.09. Motion Prairie, 2nd by Laleman to approve \$995.00 which is 50% up to \$497.55 per Well Sealing Policy. \$497.55 will be taken out of FY 21 Local Water Management. All in favor, motion carried

<u>District Technician – Luke Olson, Blake Giles and Courtney Snyder</u> - District Tech Report: field work ramping up with several grass waterways to begin construction at the end of August. CREP wetland restoration work to begin as well in next few weeks.

- RCRCA update on Redwood River dredging, discussion on downstream impacts on a private crossing that was damaged as part of discharge from settling basin will be paid for. \$7500 for culvert replacement.

- **SW Prairie TSA** Meeting in September
- Park & Rec Discussion on new bathroom at fairgrounds, work on Garvin Park continues. Discussion about options with repairing fairgrounds
- **Yellow Medicine Watershed** grant for \$200,000 for water storage modeling, targeting water storage projects
- One Watershed One Plan (Yellow Medicine) 2 projects over \$30,000 were approved by policy committee. Must go to watershed district for approval. 1 project in Lyon was not on agenda, special policy meeting will be held August 29th to present project.

- One Watershed One Plan (Des Moines) bi-laws were developed, currently in 60-day review period for the plan.
- One Watershed One Plan (Cottonwood) planning to begin in 2023
- One Watershed One Plan (Redwood) planning to begin in 2024
- County Approval of Lake Marshall 28 dam repair, Crowley remarked that Blake did an excellent job
 presenting to County Board. Murray County Ditch 14 will become Lyon & Murray Joint Judicial Ditch
 Number 14 because a portion of the benefitted area extends into Lyon. Twin Lakes campground
 discussed, essential service conditional use permit for East River electric for a new and reconstructed
 electrical line was approved at the County Board meeting.
