- Roles & Responsibilities (Steering Committee)
 - Guidance and Oversight
 - Plans align with the County vision, goals and regulatory requirements
 - Communication and Outreach
 - Serve as ambassadors for the comprehensive plan within the community, explaining its importance, benefits and implications to various stakeholders
 - Stakeholder Engagement
 - Engaging with stakeholders such as community members, local businesses, government agencies, advocacy groups to gather input, address concerns & build support
 - Long-term Visioning
 - Considering the long-term future of the county and ensuring that the comprehensive plan reflects a vision for sustainable growth, development and quality of life for current and future residents
 - Plan Development
 - Collaborating with planners, local partners, and other agencies to develop the comprehensive plan. This involves reviewing data, analyzing trends, identifying priorities and drafting plan elements
 - Consensus Building
 - Facilitating discussions and consensus-building among committee members and stakeholders with diverse interests and perspectives
 - Review and Revision
 - Reviewing draft versions of the comprehensive plan and providing feedback for revisions to ensure accuracy, completeness and effectiveness
 - Approval Process
 - Presenting the final draft of the comprehensive plan to the county

The County Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee plays a crucial role in shaping the future direction of the county through the development and implementation of a comprehensive plan that reflects future needs, values, and development
